HE WAS THE FOURTH BISHOP..1918-1922. HIS COUNSELORS WERE WALTER E. CLARK, JUNE FREEMAN, AND ERNEST P. HOFF.

THE FIRST HEATING PLANT (FLOOR FURNACE) WAS INSTALLED IN THE MEETING HOUSE AT A COST OF. \$1,000 (ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS). THERE WAS JUST A SMALL FOUR BY FOUR FOOT GRATE TO KEEP THAT BUILDING WARM.

HE SPENT MUCH OF HIS TIME VISITING THE SICK AND CARING FOR THE POOR.

HE WAS THE FIFTH BISHOP FROM 1922-1928. HIS COUNSELORS WERE EDWIN E. PINCKNEY AND ERNEST P. HOFF.

HIS FIRST WORK, BY SUPPORT OF THE PEOPLE, WAS TO PAY OFF THE WARD IN-DEBTEDNESS OF \$500 (FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS).

HE WAS ESPECIALLY INTERESTED IN GOOD AMUSEMENTS AND SCHOOLS FOR THE YOUNG. HE IMPROVED THE CEMETERY GROUNDS AND THE MEETING HOUSE.
