PREFACE

This is a transcription of an interview conducted for the Oral History Project of the Charles Redd Center for Western Studies at Brigham Young University, Provo, Utah.

The original recording has been treated as only the first stage in the creation of this manuscript. A verbatim transcript of the audio tape was made and then edited to conform to the standards of the written language. Unclarity, to a certain extent, false starts and redundancies were removed. The edited copy was returned to the interviewee for his corrections, additions, and deletions, which in some cases might have been extensive. The tape of the interview has been preserved and is available; the intermediate processing stages are also available but only upon application to the Charles Redd Center for Western Studies.
