Orange, Va April 1890

My Dear Mother: On the inst a week ago today, I received you [your] really welcome letter. It was one of interest and worth to your son. Surely God will bless my mother. I desire Him to bless those who sit in darkness and sometimes I am right proud of some qualities I feel that I have inherited; so that when men will rage and ridicule and abuse, I can be to some extent composed and imitate you when I have seen you tried in the family relationship in which I feel to bless my parents for raising me. There are children growing up who are proud of being raised in Utah, and [...]
