(PIC. WALTER EDWARD CLARK) (B- 8) HE WAS THE SIXTH BISHOP..1928-1930. HIS COUNSELORS WERE ROY H. ROBISON AND MILTON G. SMITH.

THE MEETING HOUSE WAS REMODELED AT A COST OF \$9,000 DOLLARS. IT WAS RAISED AND A BASEMENT PUT UNDER IT TO PROVIDE SPACE FOR FIVE CLASS ROOMS. THE WEST SIDE ANNEX WAS ALSO ADDED. HE WAS ESPECIALLY SUCCESSFUL IN AARONIC PRIESTHOOD LESSONS AND QUORUM ACTIVITIES.

HE WAS THE SEVENTH BISHOP..1930-1939. HIS COUNSELORS WERE MARVIN E. CLARK AND ROY H. ROBISON.

THE DEBT OF \$1,000 DOLLARS WAS PAID ON THE MEETING HOUSE. \$500 DOLLARS WAS SECURED BY DONATIONS AND \$500 DOLLARS WAS FURNISHED BY THE CHURCH. MOST OF THE \$500 DOLLARS WAS TRANSFERRED FROM THE WARD MAINTENANCE FUND WHICH HAD ACCUMULATED DURING THE PERIOD OF CONSTRUCTION.

A SECURITY PROJECT WAS LAUNCHED BY THE CHURCH. GEORGETOWN ID WAS ASSIGNED A CERTAIN PORTION. THE MEMBERS OF THE WARD GAVE SUPPORT AND IT PROVED VERY SUCCESSFUL. 22,000 LBS. OF POTATOES WAS FURNISHED TO THE STOREHOUSE IN MONTPELIER ID AND 173 QUARTS OF BOTTLED VEGETABLES AND FRUITS. 55 QUARTS WERE RETAINED FOR THOSE IN NEED. THE TOTAL OF 228 QUARTS ALONG WITH THE

POTATOES WAS SOLD TO PAY THE RENT ON THE LAND. IMPROVEMENTS WERE MADE ON THE CEMETERY AND THE MEETING HOUSE GROUNDS.
