Dear Father:

Do not spend more money for Rail Road [railroad] tickets than you feel like; for I did not make the money I am getting the benefit of and I want to do for the best. If I go as far east as Boston I go for good.

Last night I wrote you a few lines and will now write more with the view of letting you understand what I would like to do. You must do what is for the best good.

I feel like asking our Heavenly Father to be with me in leaving my field where we have Heavens [Heaven's] guidance from the evils of the world to a greatest degree. I hope to be guided in my travel till [until] I reach home.

I want to visit the Exposition and get as far East as Boston too. There is no use of taking time to explain all; but I want to see and get the benefit of traveling some to points of interest.

Hope you are feeling better than you were when Amasa wrote.
